4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 14-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Missing child - Duty to report - Penalty.

- 1. For purposes of this section and section 2 of this Act, "caretaker" means the individual
 who is responsible for the physical control of a child and who is the child's biological or
 adoptive parent, the spouse of the child's biological or adoptive parent, or an individual
 acting in the stead of a child's parent at the request of the parent or another with
 authority to make the request. "Caretaker" does not include an individual who is
 charged with the enforcement of compulsory attendance provisions under section
 15.1-20-03.
 - 2. A caretaker who is responsible at that time for the care of a child under the age of thirteen years and who is unable to make contact with or otherwise verify the whereabouts and safety of that child for a period of twenty-four hours after the caretaker knows or reasonably should have known the child is missing is guilty of a class C felony if the caretaker willfully fails to report the child as missing to law enforcement within a reasonable time after this twenty-four-hour period expires.
 - 3. A caretaker who is responsible at that time for the care of a child at least thirteen years of age but under the age of seventeen years and who is unable to make contact with or otherwise verify the whereabouts and safety of that child for a period of forty-eight hours after the caretaker knows or reasonably should have known the child is missing

1 is guilty of a class B misdemeanor if the caretaker willfully fails to report the child as 2 missing to law enforcement within a reasonable time after the forty-eight-hour period 3 expires. 4 SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 14-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 5 and enacted as follows: 6 **Death of a child - Duty to report - Penalty.** 7 A caretaker of a child in the caretaker's care is guilty of a class C felony if the 8 caretaker willfully fails to: 9 Report the child's death to a law enforcement agency within two hours after <u>a.</u> 10 learning about the child's death; or 11 Report the location of the child's corpse to a law enforcement agency within two <u>b.</u> 12 hours after learning the location of the corpse. 13 <u>2.</u> This section does not apply to the death of a child which occurs while the child is 14 under the care of a health care professional or emergency medical personnel.
