- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-10-48 and 15-10-49 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to matching grants for the advancement of academics at higher
- 3 education institutions under the control of the state board of higher education; and to provide an
- 4 appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-48 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows: 8 15-10-48. Advancement of academics - Matching grants - University of North Dakota 9 and North Dakota state university. 10 1. During the period beginning July 1, 20152017, and ending December 31, 11 20162018, the state board of higher education shall award one dollar in matching 12 grants for every two dollars raised by the institutional foundations of the university 13 of North Dakota and North Dakota state university for projects dedicated 14 exclusively to the advancement of academics. 15 To be eligible for a matching grant, an institution must demonstrate that: b. 16 Its foundation has raised at least fifty thousand dollars in cash or monetary 17 pledges for a qualifying project; and 18 The project has been approved by the grant review committee established (2) 19 in section 15-10-51. 20 C. The board may award up to seven million_____ dollars in matching grants to 21 each institution. The first two million_____ dollars in matching grants 22 awarded to each institution must be used for student scholarships that comply 23 with section 15-10-53.

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- a. If any available dollars have not been awarded by the board before January 1,
 2 20172019, in accordance with subsection 1, either the university of North Dakota
 or North Dakota state university may apply for an additional matching grant.
 - An application submitted under this subsection must meet the same criteria as an original application.
 - c. The board shall consider each application submitted under this subsection in chronological order.
 - d. If the remaining dollars are insufficient to provide a matching grant in the amount of one dollar for every two dollars raised by the institutional foundation, the board shall award a lesser amount.
 - The state board of higher education shall retain up to one-quarter of one percent of any grant awarded under this section to assist with administrative expenses incurred in the grant review process.

NOTE: The amount of grant funding available to research institutions under this section, and the amount of the grant funding required to be used by each institution specifically for student scholarships may need to be adjusted based on total appropriations provided for the challenge grant program. During the 2015-17 biennium, the Legislative Assembly provided that \$7 million of grants were available for each research institution, of which the first \$2 million of grants had to be used for student scholarships.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-49 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15-10-49. Advancement of academics - Matching grants - Two-year and four-year institutions of higher education.

- a. During the period beginning July 1, 20152017, and ending December 31, 20162018, the state board of higher education shall award one dollar in matching grants for every two dollars raised by the institutional foundations of Bismarck state college, Dakota college at Bottineau, Dickinson state university, Lake Region state college, Mayville state university, Minot state university, North Dakota state college of science, Valley City state university, and Williston state college for projects dedicated exclusively to the advancement of academics.
 - b. To be eligible for a matching grant, an institution must demonstrate that:
 - Its foundation has raised at least twenty-five thousand dollars in cash or monetary pledges for a qualifying project; and

If the remaining dollars are insufficient to provide a matching grant in the amount 13 of one dollar for every two dollars raised by the institutional foundation, the board 14 shall award a lesser amount. 15 The board may award an additional five hundred thousand_____ dollars in 3. a. 16 matching grants to institutions that have been awarded one million____ 17 dollars in matching grants under subsection 1 and apply for an additional 18 matching grant. 19 An application submitted under this subsection must meet the same criteria as an b. 20 original application. 21 The board shall consider each application submitted under this subsection in 22 chronological order. 23 If the funding provided under this subsection is insufficient to provide a matching 24 grant in the amount of one dollar for every two dollars raised by the institutional 25 foundation, the board shall award a lesser amount. 26 The state board of higher education shall retain up to one-quarter of one percent of 27 any grant awarded under this section to assist with administrative expenses incurred 28 in the grant review process.

NOTE: The amount of grant funding available to nonresearch institutions under this section may need to be adjusted based on total appropriations for the challenge grant program. During the 2015-17 biennium, the Legislative Assembly provided that each institution was eligible to receive up to \$1 million of grant funding. An additional \$500,000 grant funding pool was also available for additional distributions to any institution that received its entire \$1 million original grant allocation amount.

1	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STUDENT LOAN TRUST FUND - STATE BOARD OF
2	HIGHER EDUCATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the student loan trust fund
3	in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of, or so much of the
4	sum as may be necessary, to the state board of higher education for the purpose of awarding
5	matching grants for the advancement of academics at institutions under the control of the
6	board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The funding
7	provided in this section is considered a one-time funding item

NOTE: The 2015 Legislative Assembly appropriated total funding of \$23.5 million for higher education challenge grants for the 2015-17 biennium, of which \$21 million was from the general fund and \$2.5 million was from the student loan trust fund. Due to the February and August 2016 general fund budget allotment, the general fund appropriation for the grant program is estimated to be reduced to \$19,625,000.
