- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 50-24.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to provider reimbursement rates for the Medicaid expansion program.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 50-24.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6	50-24.1-37. (Effective January 1, 2014, through July 31, 2017) Medicaid expansion.

- The department of human services shall expand medical assistance coverage as
 authorized by the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act [Pub. L. 111-148],
- 9 as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 [Pub.
- L. 111-152] to individuals under sixty-five years of age with income below one hundred
 thirty-eight percent of the federal poverty level, based on modified adjusted gross
 income.
- The department of human services shall inform new enrollees in the medical
 assistance program that benefits may be reduced or eliminated if federal participation
 decreases or is eliminated.
- Effective January 1, 2018, provider reimbursement rates for the medical assistance
 expansion are the same as the provider reimbursement rates set for traditional
 medical assistance.
- <u>4.</u> The<u>If the</u> department shall implementimplements the expansion by bidding through
 private carriers or utilizing the health insurance exchange. The contract between the
 department and the private carrier must:
- a. Provide a reimbursement methodology for all medications and dispensing fees
 which identifies the minimum amount paid to pharmacy providers for each
 medication. The reimbursement methodology, at a minimum, must:

1			(1)	Be available on the department's website; and	
2			(2)	Encompass all types of pharmacy providers regardless of whether the	
3				pharmacy benefits are being paid through the private carrier or contractor or	
4				subcontractor of the private carrier under this section.	
5		b.	Pro	vide full transparency of all costs and all rebates in aggregate.	
6		C.	Allo	w an individual to obtain medication from a pharmacy that provides mail order	
7			serv	ice; however, the contract may not require mail order to be the sole method	
8			of se	ervice.	
9		d.	Ens	ure that pharmacy services obtained in jurisdictions other than this state and	
10			its th	nree contiguous states are subject to prior authorization and reporting to the	
11			depa	artment for eligibility verification.	
12		e.	Ens	ure the payments to pharmacy providers do not include a required payback	
13			amo	ount to the private carrier or one of the private carrier's contractors or	
14			subo	contractors which is not representative of the amounts allowed under the	
15			reim	bursement methodology provided in subdivision a.	
16	f.<u>5.</u>	Any	infor	mation provided to the department of human services or any audit firm by a	
17		pha	rmacy	y benefit manager under this section is confidential under section 44-04-17.1.

NOTE: The amendment in subsection 4 removes the legislative directive the Medicaid Expansion program be implemented through the use of private insurance carriers. If Medicaid Expansion is implemented through the Department of Human Services, the department may incur administrative expenses and require authorization of additional full-time equivalent positions.
