- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 19-24.1-05, 19-24.1-18, 19-24.1-19, and
- 2 19-24.1-34 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reapplication for registered
- 3 identification cards for marijuana and acts associated with marijuana not prohibited from
- 4 employee discipline; and to declare an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **19-24.1-05.** Qualifying patients and designated caregivers - Identification cards -

9 Issuance and denial.

- Upon receipt of a complete application for or renewal of a qualifying patient or
 designated caregiver registry identification card, the department shall verify the
 submitted information.
- 13 2. The verification methods used by the department on an application or renewal and14 accompanying documentation may include:
- a. Contacting an applicant by telephone or mail, or if proof of identity is uncertain,
 the department shall require a face-to-face meeting and the production of
 additional identification materials;
- b. Contacting the North Dakota board of medicine or North Dakota board of nursing
 to verify the certifying health care provider is licensed in the state and is in good
 standing; and
- c. Contacting the health care provider to obtain additional documentation verifying
 the qualifying patient applicant's medical diagnosis and medical condition qualify
 the applicant for participation in the medical marijuana program.

3	4.	Exce	ept a	s provided in subsection 5, the department shall issue a registry identification	
4		card	l with	in thirty calendar days of approving an application or renewal. A designated	
5		care	giver	must have a registry identification card for each of the designated	
6		care	giver	's registered qualifying patients.	
7	5.	The	depa	artment may not issue a registry identification card to a qualifying patient who	
8		is a minor unless:			
9		a.	The	department receives documentation the minor's health care provider has	
10			expl	ained to the parent or legal guardian with responsibility for health care	
11			deci	sions for the minor the potential risks of the use of pediatric medical	
12			mar	ijuana; and	
13		b.	The	department receives documentation the parent or legal guardian with	
14			resp	oonsibility for health care decisions for the minor consents in writing to:	
15			(1)	Allow the minor's use of pediatric medical marijuana to treat or alleviate the	
16				debilitating medical condition;	
17			(2)	Serve as the minor's designated caregiver or identifies a registered	
18				designated caregiver to act as the minor's designated caregiver;	
19			(3)	Control the acquisition of usable marijuana and control the dosage and	
20				frequency of the use of usable marijuana by the minor; and	
21			(4)	If serving as the minor's designated caregiver, prevent the minor from	
22				accessing the usable marijuana by storing the usable marijuana in an	
23				enclosed, locked facility.	
24	6.	If the	e dep	partment denies an application or renewal, the applicant may not reapply for	
25		one	year	from the date of the denial, unless otherwise authorized by the department,	
26		and	the a	pplicant is prohibited from all lawful privileges provided under this chapter.	
27	7.	The	depa	artment shall deny an application for or renewal of a qualifying patient's	
28		regis	stry io	dentification card if the applicant:	
29		a.	Doe	s not meet the requirements of this section or section 19-24.1-03;	
30		b.	Did	not provide the required information and materials;	

1		C.	Previously had a registry identification card revoked; or which involved
2			unauthorized minor transfer, use, or access to usable marijuana or the use of
3			usable marijuana which allowed the smoke or vapor to be inhaled by a minor;
4		d.	Provided false or falsified information or made a material misstatement-; or
5		<u>e.</u>	Previously had a registry identification card revoked three times.
6	8.	The	department shall deny an application for or renewal of a designated caregiver
7		regi	stry identification card if the designated caregiver applicant:
8		a.	Does not meet the requirements of this section or section 19-24.1-04;
9		b.	Did not provide the required information and materials;
10		C.	Previously had a registry identification card revoked which involved unauthorized
11			minor transfer, use, or access to usable marijuana or the use of usable marijuana
12			which allowed the smoke or vapor to be inhaled by a minor; or
13		d.	Provided false or falsified information or made a material misstatement: or
14		<u>e.</u>	Previously had a registry identification card revoked three times.
15	9.	Not	withstanding subsection 8, the department shall deny an application for or renewal
16		<u>of a</u>	qualifying patient or designated caregiver registry identification card for one year
17		fron	n the date of an initial revocation and five years from the date of a second
18		revo	ocation.
19	<u>10.</u>	A re	gistered qualifying patient may have no more than five registered designated
20		care	egivers.
21	10.<u>11.</u>	The	department shall notify, in writing, the qualifying patient or designated caregiver
22		app	licant of the reason for denying an application or renewal.
23	11.<u>12.</u>	The	department shall notify the following in writing:
24		a.	A registered qualifying patient if that patient's designated caregiver's application
25			or renewal is denied; and
26		b.	A registered designated caregiver if that caregiver's qualifying patient's
27			application or renewal is denied.
28	12.<u>13.</u>	The	cardholder may appeal a denial or revocation of a registry identification card to
29		the	district court of Burleigh County for hearing. The court may authorize the
30		carc	holder to appear by reliable electronic means.

1	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
2	amended and reenacted as follows:				
3	19-24.1-18. Compassion centers - Agents - Registry identification cards.				
4	1.	Upon issuance of a compassion center registry certificate, the department shall issue			
5		a re	gistry identification card to each qualified compassion center agent associated with		
6		the	the compassion center.		
7	2.	To qualify to be issued a registry identification card, each compassion center agent			
8		mus	must be at least twenty-one years of age and shall submit all of the following registry		
9		iden	identification card application material to the department:		
10		a.	A photographic copy of the agent's department-approved identification. The agent		
11			shall make the identification available for inspection and verification by the		
12			department.		
13		b.	A recent two-by-two inch [5.08-by-5.08 centimeter] photograph of the agent.		
14		C.	A written and signed statement from an officer or executive staff member of the		
15			compassion center stating the applicant is associated with the compassion center		
16			and the capacity of the association.		
17		d.	The name, address, and telephone number of the agent.		
18		e.	The name, address, and telephone number of the compassion center with which		
19			the agent is associated.		
20		f.	The agent's signature and the date.		
21		g.	A nonrefundable application or renewal fee in the amount of two hundred dollars.		
22	3.	Eac	h compassion center agent shall consent to a criminal history record check		
23		con	ducted under section 12-60-24 to demonstrate compliance with the eligibility		
24		requirements.			
25		a.	All applicable fees associated with the required criminal history record checks		
26			must be paid by the compassion center or the agent.		
27		b.	A criminal history record check must be performed upon initial application and		
28			biennially upon renewal. A compassion center agent shall consent to a criminal		
29			history record check at any time the department determines necessary.		

- c. An individual convicted of a drug-related misdemeanor offense within the
 five-year period before the date of application or a felony offense is prohibited
 from being a compassion center agent.
- 4 4. The department shall notify the compassion center in writing of the purpose for 5 denying a compassion center agent application for a registry identification card. The 6 department shall deny an application if the applicant fails to meet the registration 7 requirements or to provide the information required, if the applicant previously had a 8 registry identification card revoked subject to sections 19-24.1-05, 19-24.1-19, and 9 19-24.1-20, or if the department determines the information provided is false. The 10 cardholder may appeal a denial or revocation of a registry identification card to the 11 district court of Burleigh County for hearing. The court may authorize the cardholder to 12 appear by reliable electronic means.
- 13 5. The department shall issue a compassion center agent a registry identification card
 14 within thirty calendar days of approval of an application.
- 6. A compassion center agent with a registry identification card shall notify the
 department of any of the following within ten calendar days of the change, in a manner
 prescribed by the department:
- 18 a. A change in the cardholder's name or address; and
- b. Knowledge of a change that would render the compassion center agent no longereligible to be a cardholder.
- 7. If a compassion center agent loses the agent's registry identification card, that agent
 shall notify the department in writing within twenty-four hours of becoming aware the
 card has been lost.
- 8. If a cardholder notifies the department of items listed in this section but the nature of
 the item reported results in the cardholder remaining eligible, the department shall
 issue the cardholder a new registry identification card with a new random ten-digit
 alphanumeric identification number within twenty calendar days of approving the
 updated information and the cardholder shall pay a fee, not to exceed twenty-five
 dollars. If a cardholder notifies the department of an item that results in the cardholder
- 30 being ineligible, the registry identification card immediately becomes void.

1	9.	A compassion center shall notify the department in writing within two calendar days of
2		the date a compassion center agent ceases to work for or be associated with the
3		compassion center. Upon receipt of the notification, that individual's registry
4		identification card becomes void immediately.
5	10.	The registry identification card of a compassion center agent expires one year after
6		issuance or upon the termination of the compassion center's registration certificate,
7		whichever occurs first. To prevent interruption of possession of a valid registry
8		identification card, a compassion center agent shall renew a registry identification card
9		by submitting a complete renewal application no less than forty-five calendar days
10		before the expiration date of the existing registry identification card.
11	SEC	TION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is
12	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
13	19-2	4.1-19. Cardholders - Compassion centers - Revocation.
14	1.	The department may suspend or revoke a cardholder's registry identification card or a
15		compassion center's registration certificate for a material misstatement by an applicant
16		in an application or renewal.
17	2.	The department may suspend or revoke a registry identification card or registration
18		certificate for a violation of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter.
19	3.	If a compassion center agent or a compassion center sells or otherwise transfers
20		marijuana or usable marijuana to a person not authorized to possess marijuana or
21		usable marijuana under this chapter, the department shall revoke the cardholder's
22		registry identification card or the compassion center's registration certificate, or both. If
23		the department revokes a cardholder's registry identification card under this
24		subsection, the cardholder may not reapply for one year from the date of an initial
25		revocation and five years from the date of a second revocation. Upon a third
26		revocation or if the revocation under this subsection involved unauthorized minor
27		transfer, use, or access to usable marijuana or the use of usable marijuana which
28		allowed the smoke or vapor to be inhaled by a minor, the cardholder is disqualified
29		from further participation under this chapter.
30	4.	The department shall provide written notice of suspension or revocation of a registry
31		identification card or registration certificate.

1	a.	A suspension may not be for a period longer than six months.
2	b.	A manufacturing facility may continue to produce and process and to possess
3		marijuana and usable marijuana during a suspension, but may not transfer or sell
4		usable marijuana.
5	C.	A dispensary may continue to possess usable marijuana during a suspension,
6		but may not purchase, dispense, or transfer usable marijuana.
7	d.	The cardholder or the compassion center may appeal a denial or revocation of a
8		registry identification card or registry certificate to the district court of Burleigh
9		County for hearing. The court may authorize the cardholder or compassion center
10		to appear by reliable electronic means.
11	SECTIO	N 4. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-34 of the North Dakota Century Code is
12	amended and	d reenacted as follows:
13	19-24.1-3	34. Acts not prohibited - Acts not required.
14	1. This	s chapter does not require:
15	a.	A government medical assistance program or private insurer to reimburse a
16		person for costs associated with the medical use of marijuana;
17	b.	A person in lawful possession of property to allow a guest, client, customer, or
18		other visitor to possess or consume usable marijuana on or in that property;
19	С.	A landlord to allow production or processing on rental property; or
20	d.	A health care provider to provide a written certification or otherwise recommend
21		marijuana to a patient.
22	2. This	s chapter does not prohibit an employer from disciplining an employee for
23	pos	sessing or consuming usable marijuana in the workplace or for, working while
24	und	er the influence of marijuana, or working with marijuana in the employee's system.
25	SECTIO	N 5. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
