If the amount committed is lessthan \$35,000,000, the office of management and budget shall transfer any uncommitted amounts to the infrastructure revolving loan fund under section 6-09-49The appropriation provided in this section is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and may be continued into the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.

**SECTION 2. TRANSFER.** The office of management and budget shall transfer any remaining bond proceeds designated for deposit in the highway fund pursuant to section 7 of chapter 80 of the 2021 Session Laws to the highway fund during the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023."
