SB 2187: A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 43-47.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to adoption of the counseling compact.

Was read the first time and referred to the Workforce Development Committee.

Sens, Clemens, Boehm and Reps, Henderson, Kasper, Marschall introduced:

SB 2188: A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 14-09, and two new sections to chapter 15.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to requiring parental consent for minors' health care services, fundamental parental rights, a school district's obligation to notify parents of their rights related to education, and data collection; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Sens. Weber, Dever, Rummel and Reps. Grueneich, Mitskog, Swiontek introduced:

SB 2189: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-10-21.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to entering a closed road; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Hogan, Braunberger and Reps. Dakane, Dobervich, Schreiber-Beck introduced:

SB 2190: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 50-33-02 and 50-33-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the child care assistance program; and to provide a statement of legislative intent.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Sens. Burckhard, Axtman, Barta and Reps. Ista, Karls introduced:

SB 2191: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 39-01-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to adding physical therapists as health care professionals who can sign statements for applications for mobility-impaired parking certificates: and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

Sens. Hogue, Cleary and Reps. Lefor, Vigesaa introduced:

SB 2192: A BILL for an Act to provide for a legislative management study relating to the impact of term limits on the legislative assembly.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Sens. Paulson, K. Roers, Wanzek and Reps. Nathe, Steiner, Weisz introduced:

SB 2193: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-22-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to motor vehicle dealer licenses; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

Sens. Patten, Bekkedahl, Kannianen and Reps. Longmuir, J. Olson, Timmons introduced:

SB 2194: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a post-production royalty oversight program; and to provide an appropriation.

Was read the first time and referred to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

Sens. Clemens, Hogue, Mathern and Reps. Meier, Rohr, D. Ruby introduced:

SB 2195: A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the department of commerce for a grant for pregnancy resource services.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Sens. Patten, Beard, Bekkedahl, Kannianen and Reps. J. Olson, Richter introduced:

SB 2196: A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 61-40 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the infrastructure revolving loan fund and accrued and unpaid interest in western area water supply authority loans; to amend and reenact section 61-02-79, subsection 13 of section 61-40-05, and sections 61-40-09, 61-40-10, and 61-40-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the oversight of the western area water supply authority and the authorized line of credit.

Was read the first time and referred to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

Sen. Krebsbach introduced:

SB 2197: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the re-energize North Dakota scholarship; to provide an appropriation; and to provide an expiration date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.

Sens. Dever, K. Roers introduced:

SB 2198: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-52.4-02, 54-52.4-04, and 54-52.4-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to state employee family

Was read the first time and referred to the Workforce Development Committee.

Sens. Clemens, Vedaa, Weston and Reps. K. Anderson, Schauer, Tveit introduced:

SB 2199: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 1-01-34 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to gender usage in the North Dakota Century Code; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Sens. Sorvaag, Luick, Meyer and Reps. Mock, Pyle, Swiontek introduced:

SB 2200: A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the department of public instruction for North Dakota governor's schools.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

Sens. Meyer, Cleary, K. Roers and Reps. Dockter, Mock, O'Brien introduced:

SB 2201: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 19-24.1-15 and 19-24.1-16 and subsection 2 of section 19-24.1-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to medical marijuana certification and application fees.
