Provide an explanation as to how the request supports state priorities, improves state efficiencies, and promotes effective state government:

North Dakota, like many other states, has a severe teacher shortage. The state has used ESSER funding to create three para-to-teacher pathway programs to address this issue. They have all been extremely successful and have a waiting list of applicants. We are proposing to use GEER II funding for a fourth para-to-teacher pathway program at the high school level. A survey to school administrators indicated that over 170 North Dakotans working in our schools in some capacities are interested in participating in this program to get licensed to teach at the secondary level. This initiative supports the state priority of ensuring all students are taught by a highly qualified teacher. These dollars would improve state efficiency by expediting the process of addressing the statewide teacher shortage, which in turn would provide for effective state government.
