I am writing as a citizen and believe HB1116 is needed legislation to bring uniformity to the current campaign finance laws between various elected office holders.

Currently, school board candidates do not have to disclose their campaign finances. Although I do not perceive this legislation to be as large of a need in greater North Dakota, it is necessary in the larger school districts such as Fargo and Grand Forks. Significant monies from out of state were used for the current Fargo school board members recently elected, while those who were not elected had largely in-state donors. I believe the public deserves to know the candidate's campaign finance contributions and where this support originated.

HB1116 will make good policy.

**Testimony of Alexis Baxley**

Good afternoon Chairman Longmuir and members of the House Political Subdivisions Committee. My name is Alexis Baxley, and I serve as the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association. NDSBA represents the elected school boards of all 170 public school districts and several special education units in North Dakota.

NDSBA is supportive of election transparency. I would however like to propose what I view as a small amendment to HB 1116. I appreciate that Representative Hoverson included the population limitation in section 5, which is in alignment with the requirements of city and county officials. However, population of a school district is a more complicated number to figure than in a city or county. We know where our kids are – we do not always know the population of other properties within a school district. As you know, school districts do not always neatly follow the borders of cities or counties. In fact, I am aware of at least one school district that includes territory in eight – yes eight – different counties. Calculating district population would likely require school business managers to work with multiple county auditors to tally a population number. I believe it would be much simpler and more efficient to base the exemption number on district enrollment. This data is readily available to districts, and certainly a number we know. I have included in my testimony North Dakota city populations from the 2020 census. I have also included public school district enrollment from the fall of this current school year. I believe an equivalent enrollment number would be 1,000 students. The suggested amendment language references the “September tenth fall enrollment report.” School districts file this report annually, and it is the enrollment number used to calculate a district’s state aid.

We do appreciate the language requiring submission of the statement to the school district business manager. This is appropriate because business managers already collect school board candidates’ statements of intent and other election documents.

I will stand for any questions.

**HB 1116, NDSBA proposed amendment**

Page 3, 16.1-08.1-02.3, sub 5

*5. A candidate for city office in a city with a population under five thousand and a candidate committee for the candidate are exempt from this section. A candidate for school district office in a school district with an enrollment of less than 1,000 students as reflected in the district's most recent September tenth fall enrollment report ~~a population under five thousand~~ and a candidate committee for the candidate are exempt from this section.*

## HB 1116 Testimony

*Statement of Intent: The intent of this legislation is to require campaign finance reporting for school board elections with the goal of increasing election transparency.*

*School Board Campaign Finance Reporting Resolution*

The intent of this bill is to amend section 15.1-09-08, 16.1-05.1-02.3, and 16.1-08.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code to include language and references for required financial reporting for school board candidates and groups funding those candidates.

Whereas, section 15.1-09-07 states; "Unless otherwise provided by law, a school district election must be conducted and the votes must be canvassed in the same manner as in the election of county officers."

Whereas, the instruction document provided by the Secretary of State office titled *Running for County & Multi-County District Office* under the section titled *Campaign Finance and Disclosure* states; "Candidates for county offices must file financial disclosure statements pursuant to subsection 6 of NDCC § 16.1-08.1-02.3."

Whereas, subsection 6 of NDCC § 16.1-08.1-02.3 states; "A candidate for county office and a candidate committee for a candidate for county office shall file statements under this chapter with the county auditor. A candidate for city office who is required to file a statement under this chapter and a candidate committee for such a candidate shall file statements with the city auditor. Any other person required to file a statement under this section shall file the statement with the secretary of state."

An amendment agreed upon by the North Dakota School Board Association is a language change due to the nature of school districting. ## HB 1116 Testimony

*Statement of Intent: The intent of this legislation is to require campaign finance reporting for school board elections with the goal of increasing election transparency.*

*School Board Campaign Finance Reporting Resolution*

The intent of this bill is to amend section 15.1-09-08, 16.1-05.1-02.3, and 16.1-08.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code to include language and references for required financial reporting for school board candidates and groups funding those candidates.

Whereas, section 15.1-09-07 states; “Unless otherwise provided by law, a school district election must be conducted and the votes must be canvassed in the same manner as in the election of county officers.”

Whereas, the instruction document provided by the Secretary of State office titled *Running for County & Multi-County District Office* under the section titled *Campaign Finance and Disclosure* states; “Candidates for county offices must file financial disclosure statements pursuant to subsection 6 of NDCC § 16.1-08.1-02.3.”

Whereas, subsection 6 of NDCC § 16.1-08.1-02.3 states; “A candidate for county office and a candidate committee for a candidate for county office shall file statements under this chapter with the county auditor. A candidate for city office who is required to file a statement under this chapter and a candidate committee for such a candidate shall file statements with the city auditor. Any other person required to file a statement under this section shall file the statement with the secretary of state.”

An amendment agreed upon by the North Dakota School Board Association is a language change due to the nature of school districting. The current addition of language in Section 5 on Page 3 currently reads “A candidate for school district office in a school district with a ~~population under five thousand~~ and a candidate committee for the candidate are exempt from this section”. The amendment would change the language to read as follows, “A candidate for school district office in a school district with a **fall student enrollment total under five hundred students** and a candidate committee for the candidate are exempt from this section.”

The League of Women Voters of North Dakota (LWVND) submits this testimony in support of House Bill 1116. We appreciate the opportunity to share our perspective.

HB 1116 amends a section of the ND Century Code so that candidates for school district office (in school districts with a population of 5,000 or more) will be required to submit campaign contribution statements.

**LWVND supports this bill** for three reasons. The bill:

- 1) ensures that candidates for school district office are held to the same standard of financial transparency and compliance as candidates for other public offices in North Dakota,
- 2) gives school district voters an additional, and important, piece of information when deciding on preferred candidates,
- 3) is consistent with the LWVND's focus on empowering voters.

We understand that a similar bill, HB 1257, introduced by Representative Conmy, connects the campaign contribution statement requirement to the fall school enrollment number rather than district population. **Testimony of Alexis Baxley**

Good morning Chairman Longmuir and members of the House Political Subdivisions Committee. My name is Alexis Baxley, and I serve as the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association. NDSBA represents the elected school boards of all 170 public school districts and several special education units in North Dakota.

NDSBA is supportive of election transparency. I would however like to propose what I view as a small amendment to HB 1116. I appreciate that Representative Hoverson included the population limitation in section 5, which is in alignment with the requirements of city and county officials. However, population of a school district is a more complicated number to figure than in a city or county. We know where our kids are – we do not always know the population of other properties within a school district. As you know, school districts do not always neatly follow the borders of cities or counties. In fact, I am aware of at least one school district that includes territory in eight – yes eight – different counties. Calculating district population would likely require school business managers to work with multiple county auditors to tally a population number. I believe it would be much simpler and more efficient to base the exemption number on district enrollment. This data is readily available to districts, and certainly a number we know. I have included in my testimony North Dakota city populations from the 2020 census. I have also included public school district enrollment from the fall of this current school year. I believe an equivalent enrollment number would be 1,000 students. The suggested amendment language references the “September tenth fall enrollment report.” School districts file this report annually, and it is the enrollment number used to calculate a district’s state aid.

We do appreciate the language requiring submission of the statement to the school district business manager. This is appropriate because business managers already collect school board candidates’ statements of intent and other election documents.

I will stand for any questions.

**House Bill 1116**  
**Senate State and Local Government Committee**  
**March 16th, 2023**

The League of Women Voters of North Dakota (LWVND) submits this testimony **in support of House Bill 1116**. We appreciate the opportunity to share our perspective.

HB 1116 amends a section of the ND Century Code so that candidates for school district office (in school districts with a population of 5,000 or more) will be required to submit campaign contribution statements.

**LWVND supports this bill** for three reasons. The bill:

- 1) ensures that candidates for school district office are held to the same standard of financial transparency and compliance as candidates for other public offices in North Dakota,
- 2) gives school district voters an additional, and important, piece of information when deciding on preferred candidates,
- 3) is consistent with the LWVND's focus on empowering voters.

We understand that a similar bill, HB 1257, introduced by Representative Conmy, connects the campaign contribution statement requirement to the fall school enrollment number rather than district population. We hope the Committee will consult with the ND Secretary of State and/or the ND School Boards Association to determine the most appropriate standard for this requirement.

LWVND wishes to thank Representative Hoverson for his sponsorship of this bill, and we ask the Committee to vote in its favor.

## HB 1116 Testimony

To the State and Local Government Committee

*Statement of Intent: The intent of this legislation is to require campaign finance reporting for school board elections with the goal of increasing election transparency.*

### *School Board Campaign Finance Reporting Resolution*

The intent of this bill is to amend section 15.1-09-08, 16.1-05.1-02.3, and 16.1-08.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code to include language and references for required financial reporting for school board candidates and groups funding those candidates.

Whereas, section 15.1-09-07 states; "Unless otherwise provided by law, a school district election must be conducted and the votes must be canvassed in the same manner as in the election of county officers."

Whereas, the instruction document provided by the Secretary of State office titled *Running for County & Multi-County District Office under the section titled Campaign Finance and Disclosure* states; "Candidates for county offices must file financial disclosure statements pursuant to subsection 6 of NDCC § 16.1-08.1-02.3."

Whereas, subsection 6 of NDCC § 16.1-08.1-02.3 states; "A candidate for county office and a candidate committee for a candidate for county office shall file statements under this chapter with the county auditor. A candidate for city office who is required to file a statement under this chapter and a candidate committee for such a candidate shall file statements with the city auditor. Any other person required to file a statement under this section shall file the statement with the secretary of state."

Some questions were raised on the use of language in Section 5 on Page 3 which reads, "A candidate for school district office in a school district with a population under five thousand and a candidate committee for the candidate are exempt from this section". The decision to utilize this language has two parts. First is to mirror existing century code in the same section. Second is based on the fact schools are predominantly funded by property taxes and districts already have a base line of population based on mill levy collections. Passing this bill will appropriately reflect the original intent of sections of century code that require campaign finance reporting.

**Testimony of Alexis Baxley**

Good morning Chair Roers and members of the Senate State and Local Government Committee. My name is Alexis Baxley, and I serve as the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association. NDSBA represents the elected school boards of all 170 public school districts and several special education units in North Dakota.

NDSBA is supportive of election transparency. I would however like to propose what I view as a small amendment to HB 1116. I appreciate that Representative Hoverson included the population limitation in section 5, which is in alignment with the requirements of city and county officials. However, the population of a school district is a more complicated number to figure than in a city or county. We know where our kids are – we do not always know the population of other properties within a school district. As you know, school districts do not always neatly follow the borders of cities or counties. In fact, I am aware of at least one school district that includes territory in eight – yes eight – different counties. Calculating district population would likely require school business managers to work with multiple county auditors to tally a population number. I believe it would be much simpler and more efficient to base the exemption number on district enrollment. This data is readily available to districts, and certainly a number we know. I have included in my testimony North Dakota city populations from the 2020 census. I have also included public school district enrollment from the fall of this current school year. I believe an equivalent enrollment number would be 1,000 students. The suggested amendment language references the “September tenth fall enrollment report.” School districts file this report annually, and it is the enrollment number used to calculate a district’s state aid.

We do appreciate the language requiring submission of the statement to the school district business manager. This is appropriate because business managers already collect school board candidates’ statements of intent and other election documents.

I will stand for any questions.
