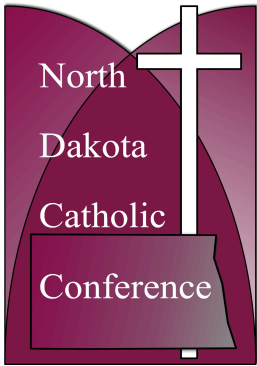

The North Dakota Catholic Conference supports House Bill 1176 as a way to help build a sanctuary for life in North Dakota.

The first part of HB 1176 is straightforward. It provides a tax credit for adoption expenses, using an already-established mechanism in the federal tax code.

The most common question I am asked in my position, especially after the *Dobbs* decision, is: “How can we make adoption more affordable?” The reasons for the cost of adoption are complex and there is no single solution to reduce cost. A tax credit for adopting parents, however, is one thing that the state is capable of doing which would provide some relief to adopting parents.

Years ago, the North Dakota tax code had provisions to help parents who adopt. That provision disappeared somewhere around 2009. Now we can restore some tax help to parents who adopt.

The second part of HB 1176 provides a tax credit for contributions to maternity homes, adoption agencies, and pregnancy resource centers. These entities are the backbone of a sanctuary for life. They accompany women during this difficult time. They hold their hands. They respond with love and provide help, resources, and direct assistance so mothers can choose life and families can have a strong start.

They already do this for hundreds of women. They will have to do this for hundreds more. Nearly 830 North Dakota women obtained abortions each year before the *Dobbs* decision. Our job as a state is to reach and help the next 830 before they cross the river. These agencies are at the frontline when it comes to this task. Let’s help them by passing HB 1176.

Please give a “Do Pass” recommendation to HB 1176.

## Chairman Craig Headland and Members of the House Finance and Taxation Committee –

My name is Sierra Heitkamp and I am the Legislative Director for North Dakota Right to Life. I am testifying today to represent the interests of our 3700 members across the state of North Dakota.

Since the overturn of Roe V. Wade on June 24, 2022, there have been many questions regarding what this means for women and families who find themselves in unplanned pregnancies in North Dakota. At North Dakota Right to Life, we questioned ourselves as to how our vision and goals may have to evolve moving forward to adequately protect those most vulnerable from conception to natural death.

After many conversations, the answer became clear – not only will we continue our work in protecting life at all stages, but we also want to back legislation that educates our citizens, encourages life, and provides aid or resources to those who qualify. A woman or family who finds themselves with an unexpected pregnancy should never feel that abortion is their only option to achieve a successful, happy life.

After discussing HB 1176 with our members and other partners in the pro-life committee, we believe that this is a wonderful step in the right direction for mothers and families in our state. The entities impacted by this bill (maternity homes, child placing agencies, or pregnancy help centers) operate on concise budgets that are sustained by donor dollars. These entities work tirelessly to provide resources for expecting mothers, options for adoption placement, and counseling services as these brave woman take the next steps in their journey. This legislation, if passed, would help encourage donors in our state to give monetary donations to these entities because of the proposed tax credit.

I ask this committee today for a **Do Pass recommendation on HB 1176** in order to protect mothers and families facing unplanned or crisis pregnancies as we continue to promote and encourage life at all stages.

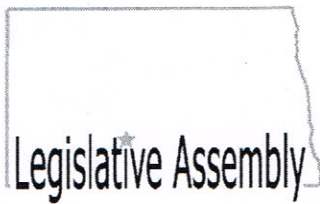

Before doing so, however, this committee ought to consider a small amendment to the bill. On page 2, line 15, the bill provides a definition of “maternity home.” It states that “‘Maternity home’ means a maternity home under chapter 50-19.” The Senate, however, passed Senate Bill 2081, which repeals Chapter 50-19, and the House will probably do the same. Therefore, HB 1176 needs a definition of “maternity home.”

The definition SB 2081 repeals was passed decades ago and does not truly reflect today’s maternity home. We suggest that HB 1176 use the following definition: “‘Maternity home’ means a facility operating for the purpose of providing shelter and care to pregnant women or parents of a child twelve months of age or younger.”

Please give a **Do Pass** recommendation to HB 1176.

## HB 1176

**A bill to create income tax credits for adoption and contributions to maternity homes, adoption agencies and pregnancy centers.**

Thank you Chairman Kannianen and members of the committee. I am Rep. SuAnn Olson, representing District 8.

North Dakota and our Legislature has been and is very family friendly. We have stood up for Life by rejecting abortion and we have many programs that support families and children. HB 1176 is another step in supporting families.

Section 1 of this bill creates a ND adoption tax credit equivalent to 10% of the federal credit for adoption expenses. I like this approach because we can piggyback off the federal credit without creating lots of administrative rules. The bill also allows a carry forward of any unused credit for a period of 3 years which is similar to many other credits in state law. The credit will generally not be more than \$1,489 since \$14,890 is the maximum per child federal credit that is allowed.

The federal credit also phases out for incomes over \$263,410 so it is also inapplicable for high income taxpayers.

Section 2 of the bill creates a tax credit for contributions to maternity homes, child placing agencies, and pregnancy help centers. Again, this action helps ensure that we have agencies that help women with unplanned pregnancies. It is the right thing to do for mom's and babies.

The credit may not exceed 50% of the ND tax for the year, limited to \$2,500. There are no carryover provisions.

For so many reasons, this bill is good for children and good for ND. We have made it clear that we value children. We want children to get off to a good start. We want and need them to grow up in ND and to stay in ND. We need them here!
