Testimony of Dr. Andrea Grondahl Livestock Industries Director North Dakota Department of Agriculture Senate Bill 2100 Senate Agriculture Committee Fort Union Room January 6, 2023

Chairman Luick and members of the Senate Agriculture Committee, I am Dr Andrea Grondahl, Director of the Livestock Industries Division of the Department of Agriculture. I am here today on behalf of the North Dakota Department of Agriculture in support of Senate Bill 2100, which would require licensure of meat processing businesses.

The Department currently only has the authority to register meat processing businesses.

There is no licensing requirement. Events in the past two years demonstrated that a registration requirement alone does not adequately protect the public. A registration requirement alone does not provide adequate statutory authority to suspend a meat processing plant from operating if they fail to meet facility safety or sanitation requirements.

It is critical that meat during processing is handled correctly in a sanitary environment and in a manner to preserve its wholesomeness. If it is not, there is a substantial risk of food borne illness. The vast majority of meat processors fully understand this and consequently meticulously abide by regulatory requirements in place to keep their meat products safe. This bill is needed for the ones that are not doing so and, as a result, are increasing the risk of making someone sick.

Most states that operate a state meat inspection program require annual licensing. This bill will only require meat processing businesses to obtain a one-time license for a nominal fee.

The sole purpose of meat facility licensure is to protect the public's health and safety by uniformly holding meat processing facilities in the State reasonably accountable for their activities and behavior. This reasonable licensing requirement will better enable the Agriculture Department to perform the job it has been tasked to do.

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Testimony of Dr. Andrea Grondahl Livestock Industries Director North Dakota Department of Agriculture Senate Bill 2100 House Agriculture Committee JW327C March 2, 2023

Chairman Thomas and members of the House Agriculture Committee, I am Dr Andrea Grondahl, Director of the Livestock Industries Division of the Department of Agriculture. I am here today on behalf of Agriculture Commissioner Doug Goehring in support of Senate Bill 2100, which would require licensure of meat processing businesses.

Currently, the Department only has authority to register meat processing businesses.

There is no licensing requirement. However, events in the past two years demonstrated that a registration requirement alone does not adequately protect the public. A registration requirement alone does not provide authority to suspend a meat processing plant from operating if they fail to meet facility safety or sanitation requirements.

This bill will not result in undue burden for meat processors as it only requires them to obtain a one-time license for a nominal fee. It will not impose any new regulations. The sole purpose of meat facility licensure is to protect the public's health and safety by ensuring regulatory compliance by meat processing facilities in the State. A license may be revoked or suspended with due cause only.
